Subject: Purse Distribution in American Superbike and Daytona SportBike

Purse payouts from doubleheader events in Daytona SportBike and American Superbike will be determined by the amount of points earned by the rider at each event, calculated by adding the points earned in Race 1 and the points earned in Race 2 combined to pay a single purse payment to the top 20 finishers, with payments to go to the Team Entrant, not the individual riders. Using the points assigned to each finishing position will determine the combined top 20 finishers for distribution of the purse. The points scale for positions 1–20 is listed on page 94 of the AMA Pro Road Race rulebook. Bonus points for fast qualifier and most laps lead will be included in the calculation for the distribution of purse.

In combining the results of riders from both races on a weekend, it is possible that there could be a tie in any finishing position. The purse breakdown has three levels of compensation, with the rider with the highest combined points total receiving \$7,500, riders 2-10 receiving \$4,000 each and riders in 11-20th position receiving \$3,000 each. In the event of a tie for 1st place, the payout will be combined for 1st and 2nd place (\$11,500) and split between both riders (\$5,750). Similarly if there is a tie for 10th place, the payout will be combined for 10th and 11th place (\$7,000) and split between both riders (\$3,500). Finally if there is a tie for 20th position, the payout for 20th place will be split between both riders. In the event that there is a tie that involves more than two riders for a position, the same formula will be used for determining distribution of the purse.
